Time of Preparation

Missionaries of the Month



Ben Castaneda, and his wife Bethel, serving in Edinburgh, Scotland as a lecturer in Greek and New Testament at Edinburgh Theological Seminary (ETS).

Though Scotland is the birthplace of Presbyterianism, it has grown to be an un-churched and de-churched nation. ETS is committed to raising up and training faithful, evangelical ministers and Bible scholars to reach Scotland, the UK, and Europe with the Gospel. Additionally, since Ben is an ordained minister in the PCA, the Castaneda family supports the local church in Edinburgh, which includes many church planting efforts.

Current prayer requests:

- Please pray for their specific congregation and all congregations of the Free Church of Scotland, which is a sister organization of the PCA. Pray for spiritual growth for those already attending, and that the Lord will lead many more to salvation through the church. Pray for God to raise up men to pastoral ministry in Scotland (and worldwide).
- Glasgow Presbytery has 29 congregations but only about 15 ministers (with a couple more off work due to health issues). As a result, Ben is now serving as the temporary moderator of a vacant church south of Glasgow. Please pray for wisdom as he chairs their Session meetings and provide leadership for the church until they call a minister of their own.
- Finally, please pray for Ben, his wife, Bethel, and their 5 children.

Who may come to the Lord's Table?

The Lord's Supper is for all who are baptized and a professing member in good standing at a church that professes the gospel. The Lord prepares the table for those displeased with themselves because of their sins, but who nevertheless trust that their sins are pardoned and that their continuing weakness is covered by the blood of Christ, and who desire more and more to strengthen their faith and to walk by the Spirit.

But those who are unbelieving or living in ungodliness should not come to the table until they reform their lives, for one should not dishonor God's covenant and bring down his anger upon the entire congregation. Instead, use this time to meditate on the following prayer: *Lord Jesus Christ, I admit that I am weaker and more sinful than I ever dared admit, but through you I am more loved and accepted than I ever dared hope. I thank you for paying my debt on the cross, taking what I deserved in order to offer me complete forgiveness. Knowing that you have been raised from the dead, I turn from my sins and receive you as my Lord and Savior. Amen.*

Deacons' Mercy Corner

The job of a Deacon is, most simply stated, to be a minister of mercy. Within the church body our Deacons provide help to members of the congregation in times of need. They also help tie our congregation to other local organizations which share in ministering mercy. Two such organizations which GPC financially supports are Veritas Christian Community School and CareNet Crisis Pregnancy Center of Sierra Vista.

Here is a message from Micky Unger, Head of School Veritas Christian Community School:

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

God has blessed Veritas Christian Community School tremendously and continues to bless us now! One area in which we have been blessed is our school building. We now have our own campus, and a wonderful staff with a heart for God and children. With the new campus, our classrooms are sized for 15 students per class, which means our maximum enrollment is 195 total students in K-12. We currently only have about 110 students enrolled for the upcoming 2026-2027 school year.

Our school serves as a ministry to Christian families in the area, and we want to ensure these families are aware that our school exists as a Christ-centered and classical alternative to secular public schools and charter schools.

Veritas strives to operate as an extension of the Christian family. Many Christian families have little to no knowledge of Veritas and the state programs (ESA and STO) available to cover the cost of tuition. It is on our hearts to find ways of helping these families learn about us so that they can make more informed choices on where to educate their children. Given the choice, we believe many Christian families would jump at the chance to enroll their children at Veritas.

Our mission statement is as follows: "Veritas Christian Community School provides a Christ-centered, biblically rooted, classical education that cultivates truth, beauty, and goodness within its staff, students, families, and community, while ministering to the local community, churches, and families by offering a Christ-centered alternative to secular education." Education at Veritas is intended to be inherently different in philosophy and content from that offered in secular schools. Our goal with this letter is to give families time to pray and seek information and then make an informed decision on where to enroll their children for the 2026-2027 school year.
