San Pablo Seminary "Servants for Christ's Sake"

Founded in 2000 as a ministry of Christ the King (PCA) in El Paso, TX, San Pablo Seminario has graduated more than 60 people who now serves as pastors, leaders, and church planters in Mexico and the southern United States.

The seminary has also recently received the formal endorsement of the Rio Grande Presbytery of the PCA, which has decided to accept seminary graduates as ministerial candidates within its denomination. As a result of this growing relationship, two graduates have recently been ordained as pastors within the PCA, and several more are in the process of ordination.

Who may come to the Lord's Table?

The Lord's Supper is for all who are baptized and a professing member in good standing at a church that professes the gospel. The Lord prepares the table for those displeased with themselves because of their sins, but who nevertheless trust that their sins are pardoned and that their continuing weakness is covered by the blood of Christ, and who desire more and more to strengthen their faith and to walk by the Spirit.

But those who are unbelieving or living in ungodliness should not come to the table until they reform their lives, for one should not dishonor God's covenant and bring down his anger upon the entire congregation. Instead, use this time to meditate on the following prayer: *Lord Jesus Christ, I admit that I am weaker and more sinful than I ever dared admit, but through you I am more loved and accepted than I ever dared hope. I thank you for paying my debt on the cross, taking what I deserved in order to offer me complete forgiveness. Knowing that you have been raised from the dead, I turn from my sins and receive you as my Lord and Savior. Amen.*

Deacons' Mercy Corner

Two such organizations which GPC financially supports are Veritas Christian Community School and CareNet Crisis Pregnancy Center of Sierra Vista.

Veritas Christian Community School will begin classes on August 10th, 2026 for the new school year. Please be in prayer for the teachers, staff, students, and families. More specific needs will be posted as the start of the school year approaches.

CareNet Crisis Pregnancy Center recently received a generous donation of over \$33,000, allowing them to finally purchase the van designed to bring ultrasound equipment out to communities that are far from this service. Praise God!!

 - b) **Future need for coffee set up/take down:** Jon will make coffee again when he returns, but when he leaves to join Shannon permanently we will need a new person or people in charge of the coffee.
